

Yeshiva of Far Rockaway has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Yeshiva of Far Rockaway will receive or has received a total of (amount of Pot 1 allocation. This is the student grant portion) \$11,876 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Yeshiva of Far Rockaway has disbursed \$8100 to 27 students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of June 8, 2020.

The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of June 8, 2020 is 36.

The method used by Yeshiva of Far Rockaway to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive is based on the allocation that the school received for the student grants, the number of Title IV eligible students, expenses for food, course material, equipment needed to participate in the educational program due to the disruption of campus operations, travel home expenses and health care related expenses. The CARES Act Emergency Financial Aid Grant awarded to dependent students is \$300.

Students received the following instructions with their grants: "As per the CARES Act, these grants are to be used for expenses that are related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19, including things like course materials and technology as well as food, housing, health care, and childcare.
